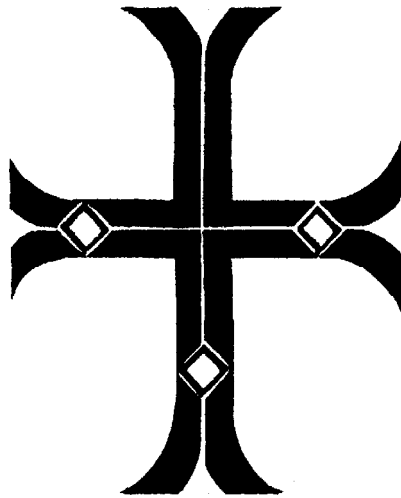

that, by the help of your mercy,  
we may be always free from sin

hard the lonely path your trod.

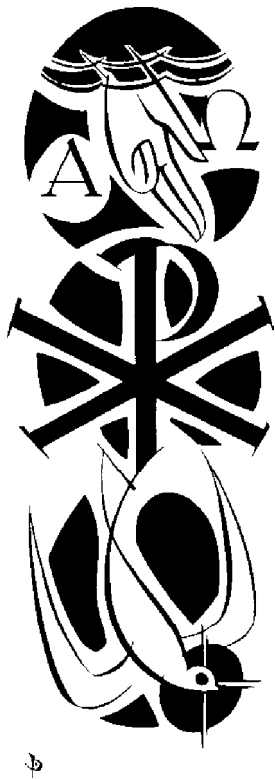
By your cross is sin defeated,
