

- In order to reduce the spread of Covid-19, and according to the authorities, The Bishops Conference of Scotland have taken the decision that all public celebrations of the Eucharist are suspended and all the faithful of our diocese are exempt from the Sunday provision.
- Let us not forget that at home we can pray alone or with the family. And that we find God also in the people around us. Many people are alone particularly, during this period of isolation. They will not be able to go out to buy food or medicine and they will also need the comfort of company or a phone call.
- Pope Francis emphasizes the importance of prayer, recalling how the Apostles turn to Jesus to save them during the storm on Lake Tiberias (Mark 4:35-41). "Prayer helps us understand our vulnerability", Pope Francis says.
