The Journey of Elijah

The Scripture

1 Kings 19: 4-8

Elijah himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree.
He asked that he might die:
'It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors.'

Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, 'Get up and eat.' He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water.

He ate and drank, and lay down again. The angel of the Lord came a second time, touched him, and said,

'Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you.' He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food for forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.

Mark 6: 30-44

The apostles gathered around Jesus,

and told him all that they had done and taught.

And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them.

They said to him, 'Are we to go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread, and give it to them to eat?'


And he said to them, 'How many loaves have you?'

And all ate and were filled; and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. Those who had eaten the loaves numbered five thousand men.

Theme 4a: Faith Journey

Introduction:

Themes 4 will focus on scripture passages from the old and new testaments in which God the Father and God the Son provides nourishment his followers on their journey of faith, very much in the same way at we are nourished by the Eucharist given to us by Jesus in our own journey of faith. A similar approach to teaching each scripture passage can be taken (appendix?) and an exemplar is provided for one reading in each section. It should be noted that it is not compulsory for all scripture passages to be taught, some teachers might decide to focus on fewer passages, but cover them in greater detail.

The Mass and the Road to Emmaus
Match the relevant part of the Mass with the events
from Scripture (Luke 24:13-35,). Cut out and laminate
each card and ask the pupils to match the parts and

Gathering Rite – we gather in the church, the priest joins us and says, "The Lord be with you. Although we cannot see Jesus, we know from Scripture that he is with us when we gather in his name.

Penitential Rite – we call to mind our sins and ask God to forgive us. This is our opportunity to talk to God about the things that we are finding difficult and ask him to help us to do better.

Liturgy of the Word – we listen to the Word of God as the Scriptures are proclaimed. The priest then interprets them for us in his homily.

Liturgy of the Eucharist – during the consecration Jesus becomes physically present to us in the form of the Blessed Sacrament. We can see him with our own eyes.

Concluding Rite – at the end of every Mass the priest or deacon says, "Go in peace". This means that we should go into the world and bring the Christ that we have received to others, telling them about what we have seen and heard.

In response to the disciples' concerns and struggles Jesus referred to Scripture and interpreted it for them.


Jesus stayed with the disciples for supper. He took the bread, said the blessing, broke it and gave it to them. At this moment the disciples' eyes were opened and they recognised him.

The disciples were unable to contain their joy and ran all the way back to Jerusalem to tell their friends about what had happened and how they had encountered Jesus.

4. The Last Supper











Core Learning

Eucharist: Thanksgiving to God, The Last Supper took place during the celebration of Easter when the Jewish people gave thanks to God for freedom from slavery. (Son of God 1-06a, 07a)

Sacrifice of the Mass: Jesus' death and resurrection made present (Son of God 1-07a)

I know that, at the Last Supper, Jesus chose bread and wine, which nourish us physically, as symbols of the spiritual nourishment he wished to give us.

I know that we are spiritually nourished in the Eucharist because the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ at the Consecration.

The Scripture

Matthew 26:17-30

On the first day of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying, 'Where do you want us to make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' He said, 'Go into the city to a certain man, and say to him, "The Teacher says, My time is near; I will keep the Passover at your house with my disciples." 'So the disciples did as Jesus had directed them, and they prepared the Passover meal.

When it was evening, he took his place with the twelve; and while they were eating, he said, 'Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me.' And they became greatly distressed and began to say to him one after another, 'Surely not I, Lord?' He answered, 'The one who has dipped his hand into the bowl with me will betray me. The Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that one by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that one not to have been born.' Judas, who betrayed him, said, 'Surely not I, Rabbi?' He replied. 'You have said so.'

While they were eating, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to the disciples, and said, 'Take, eat; this is my body. Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you; for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you, I will never again drink of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom.'

Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet

The Scripture

John 13:1-17

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him. 'Lord, are you going to wash my feet?' Jesus answered, 'You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand.' Peter said to him, 'You will never wash my feet.' Jesus answered, 'Unless I wash you, you have no share with me.'Simon Peter said to him, 'Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!' Jesus said to him. 'One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you.' For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, 'Not all of you are clean.'

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, 'Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them.



Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, 'Go and prepare the Passover meal for us that we may eat it.' They asked him, 'Where do you want us to make preparations for it?' 'Listen,' he said to them, 'when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him into the house he enters and say to the owner of the house, "The teacher asks you, 'Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' "He will show you a large room upstairs, already furnished. Make preparations for us there.' So they went and found everything as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover meal.

When the hour came, he took his place at the table, and the apostles with him. After the Gospel, the priests delivers his Homily. This is when the priests talks to the people about the readings, gospel or another important message.

After the homily we say together the Creed - This is where we proclaim all the things we believe about our faith. We can preay the Nicene Creed or the Apostles' Creed

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God. the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God. born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Eather: through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, At the words that follow, up to and including and became man, all bow. and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit. the Lord, the giver of life. who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness

of sins

of the dead

and I look forward to the resurrection

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Apostles Creed

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In this line, the word 'hell' means 'place where dead people go'. It comes from the Greek word 'hades'. Your teacher can explain this to you in more detail.

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

Unconsecrated

means that the bread and wine is just normal bread and wine. It hasn't became the body and blood of Jesus yet. This happens during the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass.

The Greatest Commandment

The Scripture

Matthew 22:34-40

When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. 'Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?'

He said to him,

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind."

This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself."

On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.'
