Beginning Experience Mission

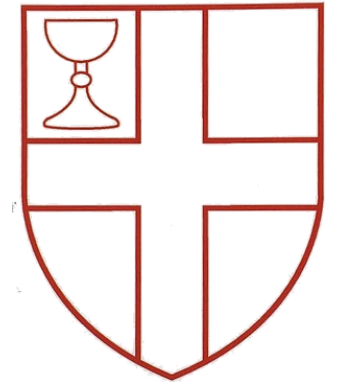

It offers a Catholic ministry to people in recovery and their families, deepening faith and sharing the healing mercy of God. Calix embodies the Catholic Church's growing emphasis on the "New Evangelisation" as encouraged by His Holiness Pope Francis.

Meetings begin every Friday in St Stephen's Church, Coatbridge at 7.00 pm. The meetings after Mass have a different focus each week of the month – ranging from a fresh introduction to the basics of Catholic faith, Meditation, Step Recovery, Reflection on the Gospels, Reconciliation and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Visitors welcome from all 12 step programmes, especially Alcoholics Anonymous and AAnon.

The first Focolare was opened in Liverpool in 1964. The Movement developed steadily, and by the late 70s there were Focolare houses in London, Liverpool, Leeds and Glasgow. As well as local meetings and activities, the annual Mariapolis gatherings helped people of all ages and backgrounds to keep in contact.

Our aim is to contribute to building a more united world in which people value and respect diversity. We are inspired by Jesus' prayer to the Father, "May they all be one." (Jn. 17:21).

The desire to love everyone, without discrimination, to take the initiative and love other people the way we love ourselves, to exclude no one, not even our enemies. There are three elements upon which the Movement is based: the art of loving, community and dialogue.

JUSTICE & PEACE

The Scottish Catholic Justice and Peace Commission was formed in 1979. It is the Scottish Commission of the [Pontifical Council Justitia et Pax](#). In January, 2017, this Council was subsumed into the new [Dicastery for Integral Human Development](#).

The constituency of Justice and Peace is just over a thousand people out of a Catholic population in Scotland of about 841,000

Each of Scotland's eight dioceses is entitled to send an official representative to the National Commission. Also represented are the religious, missionary and secular clergy; youth and ecumenical representatives; and [SCIAF](#) – the Scottish Catholic International Aid Fund.

This Commission meets quarterly. A Standing Committee which includes President, Chair, Vice-Chair, may convene for urgent decisions.

The Commission is serviced by a part time National Office staff of two.

The Society of St Vincent de Paul is an international organisation of Catholic lay people, men and women, who practice Christianity by helping those in need on a person to person basis. The aim of the Society is to provide a means whereby members can practice Christianity by showing God's love to their neighbours who are in need. SSVP members show this love, compassion and understanding by giving of themselves – their concern, their friendship, their time, their talents – to help people regardless of creed, colour, lifestyle or political belief.

Help is not confined to the needy close at hand. It may be given to people overseas through the partnership with SSVP members on the spot. This means that the help is never impersonal. Help may be in the form of counselling, moral support, relief from loneliness, or in referring people to other agencies or specialist organisations. It will vary according to the resources of the members and should be adapted to local requirements and changing conditions. The type of help is not restricted, provided the element of personal involvement of the member is present.

Spred began in America over 50 years ago by Fr James McCarthy, Sr Mary Therese Harrington and Susanne Gallagher and was so successful that there are now SPRED groups worldwide including Australia, Mexico and of course, Scotland. The Catholic Church in Scotland now has groups in Glasgow, Paisley, Galloway, Edinburgh and Motherwell.

We meet in small groups of 12 - 14, that is, 6 learning disabled people and six to 8 helpers. We work one to one with our learning disabled friends, so special friendships are formed. Our aim is for our learning disabled friends to appreciate that God is all around us, no matter what goes on in our lives. The format for each session is taken from a book that is provided each year. We are not a social group, we offer gentle catechesis to nurture and expand our love of God and each other. We are however very sociable and enjoy a good blether over a cup of tea and we know how to throw a good party!
